

But I have a street licensed 4x4?

These are all questions we hear quite frequently. Here are the specifics, if you own a full-size street legal 4x4 and you drive a 'full-size motorized trail' in Colorado, you need to have an OHV sticker. Full-Size Motorized Trails are specifically categorized to include street legal and non-legal 4x4 vehicles. Motorized Trails are not part of the Forest Service road system and are not maintained through their road budget. You can find a full list of the current 'Full-Size Motorized Trails"


